- If you have no plans and no intention of attending the dinner, then either ignore the following, or read it for the sake of interest.

• If, however, you are thinking about attending the occasion even slightly positively, I sincerely hope this will help you make up your mind in the totally positive. (Yes, I'm still using adverbs! The rest of Australia appears to have forsaken them.)

The Commemorative Dinner will be held on Sunday, April 19th, 2015, starting at 6.30pm at the Sebel Kirkton Park, 336, Oakey Creek Road, Pokolbin, NSW 2320.

(For those outside Australia, add '61' as the code to get in to Australia, but leave off the '0' before the State code number.)

Just give Sebel your credit card details, and you will pay for your room, drinks, other meals and incidentals etc. when you leave. Quote 'Framlingham Reunion' for the appropriate rate. 'Reservations' will be able to give you the room rate at the time you phone.

(Re. accommodation.** See below.)

Also, send Mike Garnett \$100 **per person**, which will cover your predinner drinks and canapés in the private courtyard, your buffet meal and ancillaries during the evening, but not personal drinks at the dinner itself; they will be billed to your room.

On arrival at the Courtyard at 6.30pm you will be registered and receive a **large print nametag**, (specifically for the over 45's).

There will be hot and cold canapés, sparkling wine* or orange juice, in a private courtyard where Mike, Rebecca and I will make you very welcome.

We will then proceed to the James Busby Room for our private dining where we will partake in a Gourmet Buffet Dinner that should have a selection to please everyone, and includes cheeseboard and coffee. Your drinks at dinner will be charged to your room, although we are trying to arrange for a complimentary Port for those who wish to partake. If you have specific food requirements, please let me know and I'll have a word in Chef's ear. I will send you a menu closer to the time.

Speeches will be kept to a minimum, and there will be a rather fine surprise package for you at your table, with a little something for the ladies. Good Afternoon Chris,

Thank you for your email. Your understanding of the rooms we have held for you currently is mostly correct. We provide you with an update at the end of December however the release is not until January.

From your confirmation, note the below:

At 110 days out (Tuesday 30th December 2014) we will review the accommodation block & advise you of how many rooms have been booked. At this time we do ask that you review your delegate attendee list & advise if you wish to release any rooms. We also ask that you contact all delegates that have not booked as yet to contact us AS SOON AS POSIBLE to make their booking.

At 90 days out (Monday 19th January 2015) we will review the accommodation block & release all unsold rooms for potential resale. After this time we cannot guarantee availability or the contracted rates, any further bookings will be subject to hotel availability at the best available rate.

Any unsold on this date in January will be released back for general sale. We are still able to secure rooms for you, however they will be subject to availability and at the

best available rate.

We actually already have guests booked from Friday 17th and guests departing on Thursday 23rd. any guests are welcome to book either side of your event, again, subject to availability and on best available rate at time of booking. I have attached a current rooming list for your information.

You will also note your reservation entered as Chris Shaw from the 18th to the 21st.
