Format:

- 12 players max. per squad (all must be genuine old boys! No ringers!)
- 6 players (including GK) on field at any one time
- 14 teams competing in 4 pools
- Top two teams in each pool will go through to the main quarter finals
- 3rd placed teams will go to the plate competition
- 4th placed in pool B and C will play off for the "wooden spoon"
- All matches (including finals) will be 15 minutes one way.

Arrival

• Teams are asked to arrive in time for a 10.45 briefing.

Rules

Latest laws of hockey apply & a couple of local rules will be clarified on the day itself.

Timing

- All matches will be centrally timed and must be started on time.
- All matches will be 15 minutes one way, including the finals.
- Matches must start on time in order for the day to run smoothly. An automatic 3-0 loss will be the result for any team not showing for the prompt start of any match.

Balls and Colours!

- The first named side must provide the match ball, which must be of normal weight.
- In the event of a colour clash, the second named team must change, or wear bibs.

Umpires

We would hope to be able to have neutral umpires throughout the day, however please be prepared to provide an umpire should the need arise.

Points

In pool games, 3 points will be awarded for a win and 1 for a draw.

Ties

In the event of a tie in the <u>pool games</u>, the following will decide the final placing:

- (a) The winner of the match between the two teams
- (b) Goal difference
- (c) Goals scored
- (d) Goals conceded
- (e) Barrage of three penalty strokes by different players from the squad
- (f) Sudden death penalties by each member of the squad (the same players may take a stroke again)

Ties in the semi-finals and finals will be decided by:

(a) Extra time golden goal, up to a maximum of 5 minutes



(b) Penalty strokes as in (d) and (e) above
