

## RONALD HENRY NEVILLE CLARKE (16-21)

He was born on 29 June 1904 in India and was the brother of **Laurence George Edward Clarke (16-20)**. While at the College he was Head Prefect and winner of a number of prizes.

On leaving the College he went to Sandhurst where he won Prize Cadetship in 1923. His Sandhurst Gentleman Cadet Register contains the following information :

In the Army he joined 1<sup>st</sup> Bn Sherwood Foresters (Notts & Derby Regt.). He was appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt 31 December 1924 and Lt in 1926.

He served in WW2 and died in the defence of Dunkirk on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> May 1940. Age 36. He is remembered on the Dunkirk Memorial.



His death certificate states the following :-

*Place of Death : Bray Dunes near Dunkirk France Killed in action.*






He's 4<sup>th</sup> from the left in the front row of this photo
