Well done to all those who took part in the Spring Concert and worked so hard on their performance.

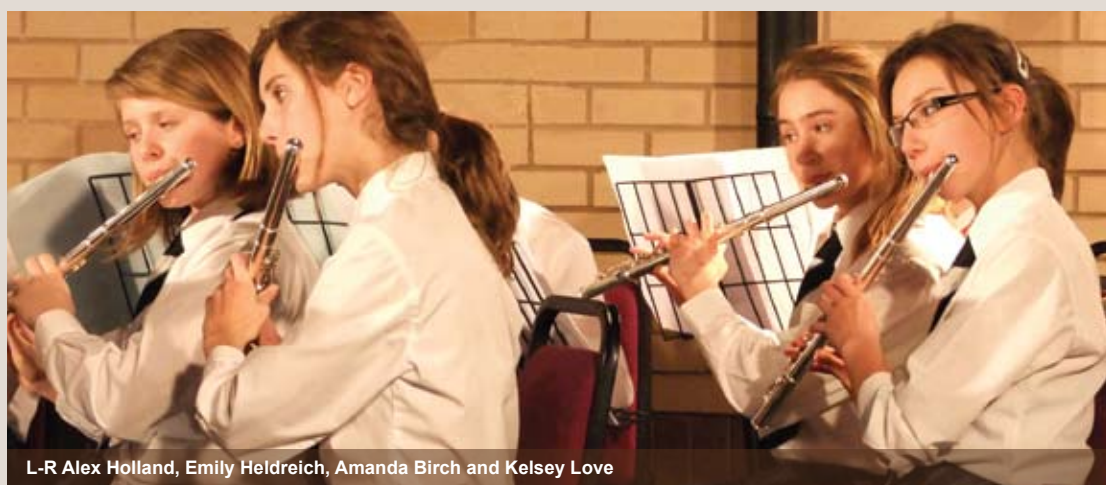
