Riding for Bowel Cancer Awareness and Research

Who am I: My name is John Masson, I'm a 42 yr old gastroenterologist (a doctor that looks

after patients with diseases of the bowel). I have worked at the Townsville

Hospital for the last 7 yrs since my wife and I migrated from the UK.

Bowel Cancer: The lifetime risk of bowel cancer is 1 in 20. It is the 2nd commonest cause of

> cancer related deaths in Australia and each year kills 4,500 Australians. Bowel cancer is largely a preventable disease. Large studies have shown that screening for bowel cancer reduces deaths. Population screening has been accepted in many

countries but Australia is yet to implement a screening policy.

Why the ride: In September 2003 I started bike riding, initially commuting and later training with more enthusiasm. In what I consider a "midlife" challenge I decided to take

4 weeks leave during September to cycle from Sydney to Townsville. The route is 2100 kms through country NSW and Qld (a shorter and guieter route than the

coast road!)

Townsville ~ 2,100 km Sydney

Such an endeavour deserves a reason and I have chosen Bowel Cancer, a condition I see most days at work. I am hoping to attract sponsorship towards Bowel cancer research and equipment for detecting bowel cancer. A research fellow investigating bowel cancer for 1 year and two colonoscopes requires funding of \$110,000. Fundraising is supported by Townsville Hospital Foundation. The trip will also provide an opportunity to raise public awareness about the risk of bowel cancer and screening options. I plan to organise evening public information and discussion meetings both in Townsville and in the rural centres I will be cycling through.

Also on the trip:

I will be accompanied by my brother-in-law from Brisbane, Doug Herd, aged 32 yrs. My 72 yr father, who has had first hand experience of the benefits of screening for bowel cancer, will drive our support vehicle.
